Addendum to the Community Standards
COVID-19 and Public Health Informed Campus Policies
2020-2021

The University Village intends to perform its educational mission while protecting the health and safety of its residents and staff, and minimizing the potential spread of the novel coronavirus, COVID-19, within the community.

Risks of COVID-19

In order to understand the risks that you face by returning to campus, you must understand that COVID-19 is a highly infectious, life-threatening disease declared by the World Health Organization to be a global pandemic. There is no vaccine for COVID-19 at this time. COVID-19's highly contagious nature means that contact with others or contact with surfaces that have been exposed to the virus, may lead to infection. Additionally, individuals who may have been infected with COVID-19 may be asymptomatic for a period of time or may never exhibit symptoms at all. Because of its highly contagious and sometimes "hidden" nature, it is very difficult to control the spread of COVID-19 or to determine whether, where, or how a specific individual may have been exposed to the disease.

The University Village cannot and does not guarantee a COVID-19-free environment, and there remains a risk that you may contract COVID-19 if you come to live with us.

In order to minimize the risks associated with COVID-19, the policies and guidelines below are incorporated into the University Village Community Standards and are applicable to all residents. Your compliance with these requirements is essential to assisting the University Village in minimizing the risks to you and other members of the community.

As scientific understanding of the virus increases, it is likely that guidance from public health authorities and directives from the government will change. Please note the following expectations:

- If a new guidance/policy is more restrictive than what is listed here, all residents are expected to immediately comply with the new measures announced.
- If the new guidance/policy is less restrictive than what is listed here, all residents are expected to continue abiding by these measures until the University Village notifies them they have changed.

Expectations/Rules:

- Residents are expected to follow the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) guidelines, as well as the University Village License Agreement and the Community Standards while living on the property.
- Residents are expected to wear a mask/face covering:
 - While accessing public services at the University Village
 - Community Center: front office, computer lab, and staff offices
 - Recreation Center: mail room, laundry room, tech center, and staff offices
 - Outside while within six (6) feet of another person
 - When leaving your assigned apartment
 - Any other designated location
- Residents are required to complete the Cal Poly Pomona Student Health Screener on a daily basis: <https://www.cpp.edu/student-health-screener>
- Residents understand that non-resident and resident guests are prohibited at the University Village until further notice.
- Residents cannot visit or enter apartments in which they are not assigned until further notice
- Residents are responsible for maintaining a social distance of at least six (6) feet from other persons
- Residents are expected to engage in frequent hand-washing and follow proper sneeze and cough etiquette, as recommended by the CDC
- Residents are expected to clean and disinfect high-touch surfaces in their assigned apartment/room

Again, it is essential that you understand and follow the directives of state and county officials, and the University Village staff. The above conditions may change, and residents agree to follow all University Village directives relating to COVID-19 and public health requirements. Any failure to adhere to any of the above directives is a violation of the Community Standards, and may result in conduct sanctions/resolutions, including possible eviction from the University Village.
